What is Liturgy?

- ∞ **Liturgy** is the central act of worship in the church requiring full, active and conscious participation by the laity.
- ∞ The Mass is the first and foremost liturgical action.
- ∞ Other liturgical rites include:
 - the Sacraments – baptism, confirmation, reconciliation, matrimony, holy orders, and anointing of the sick
 - penitential services
 - funerals
 - the daily prayer of the Church



Who prepares it?

- ∞ The **Liturgy team** is a group of people with representatives from the three worshipping communities of St Bernard's, St Catherine's and St Martin's.
- ∞ The skills and talents of this group are channelled into responsibility for various aspects of liturgy:
 - Junior Ministers,
 - Lectors,
 - Musicians,
 - Extraordinary Ministers of Communion
 - those responsible for the environment.
- ∞ Other activities for which the liturgy team is responsible include
 - formation of liturgical ministers
 - writing prayers of intercession



What does it mean for our parish?

The Liturgy Team

- ∞ ensures that the celebration of Sunday Eucharist is so well organized that every celebration encourages the active participation of all present.
- ∞ encourages the sponsoring of speakers who can enhance the spiritual development of all members of our parish community.
- ∞ prepares for the seasons of the Church year – Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter so that beautiful vibrant liturgies are assured.
- ∞ Plans or supports additional parish prayer events such as ecumenical prayer services, lenten observances and special feast days.
